## Follow These Tips for a Safe Harvest Season

September 17-23 is National Farm Health and Safety Week! According to the U.S. Bureau Labor Statistics, the agricultural industry is one of the most dangerous jobs in America with 573 fatalities each year. Fall harvest is the most dangerous season of the year for farmers. Follow these safety tips to avoid an electrical contact this season:

- Maintain a 10-foot clearance around all utility equipment in all directions.
- Use a spotter and deployed flags to maintain safe distances from power lines and other electrical equipment when working in the field.
- If your equipment makes contact with an energized or downed power line, contact 9-1-1 immediately and remain inside the vehicle until the power line is de-energized. In case of smoke or fire, exit the cab by making a solid jump out of the cab (without touching it), and hop away to safety.
- Consider equipment and cargo extensions of your vehicle. Lumber, hay, tree limbs, irrigation pipes and even bulk materials can conduct electricity, so keep them out of contact with electrical equipment.

## Need Help with Your Heating Bill?

The 2023-2024 Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) helps qualifying low-income lowa homeowners and renters pay for a portion of their primary heating costs for the winter heating season. The assistance is based on household income, household size, type of fuel, and type of housing.

#### WHEN TO APPLY:

- Elderly (60+) and/or disabled: Oct. 1, 2023 to April 30, 2024.
- All other households: Nov. 1, 2023 to April 30, 2024.

#### WHAT TO TAKE:

- Proof of Income (for all household members age 19 and over). Depending upon your household income type, income documentation from the past 30 days, the last 12 months, or last calendar year, whichever is easier or more beneficial for you;
- Proof of Social Security Numbers for all household members (documentation required);
- · Most recent heat bill; and
- Most recent electric bill.

Wage Earners: Please bring copies of your check stubs for the 30-day period preceding the date of application, or a copy of your most recent federal income tax return

Fixed Income: This income may include Social Security Benefits, Supplemental Security Income, Family Investment Program, Veteran's Assistance, Unemployment Insurance, and pensions. Please bring copies of your check stubs from the previous 30 days.

Self-Employed/Farmers: Please bring a copy of your most recent federal income tax return.

FIP Recipients: Please bring your current DHS Notice of Decision or contact your local office for acceptable document information.

#### NEW CIPCO CEO ATTENDS AUGUST BOARD MEETING

The Board of Directors welcomed a special visitor to their meeting Aug. 31.

Andrew St. John, CEO of Central Iowa Power Cooperative (CIPCO) who was named to that position in May, attended the meeting in order to meet board members face-to-face and provide an update on our cooperative's power supply. As a CIPCO Memberowner, PCEA purchases power from CIPCO that is then distributed to our members' homes and

St. John said the wind, solar, and natural gas resources CIPCO has recently brought online continue to perform well. CIPCO continues to look for new generation to support the growing demand for power, and is closely monitoring federal emissions regulations that pose a risk for coal and natural gas plants. He emphasized

CIPCO's support of an "all of the above" power supply strategy that includes dispatchable resources, while also building wind and solar assets into the power supply.
