Follow These Tips for a Safe Harvest Season

September 15-21 is National Farm Health and Safety Week! According to the U.S. Bureau Labor Statistics, the agricultural industry is one of the most dangerous jobs in America with 573 fatalities each year. Fall harvest is the most dangerous season of the year for farmers. Follow these safety tips to avoid an electrical contact this season:

- Maintain a 10-foot clearance around all utility equipment in all directions.
- Use a spotter and deployed flags to maintain safe distances from power lines and other electrical equipment when working in the field.
- If your equipment makes contact with an energized or downed power line, contact 9-1-1 immediately and remain inside the vehicle until the power line is de-energized. In case of smoke or fire, exit the cab by making a solid jump out of the cab (without touching it), and hop away to safety.
- Consider equipment and cargo extensions of your vehicle. Lumber, hay, tree limbs, irrigation pipes and even bulk materials can conduct electricity, so keep them out of contact with electrical equipment.

The Power of Preparation

With severe weather events occurring more frequently, now more than ever, it makes sense to be prepared. During a prolonged power outage or other emergency, this means having enough food, water and supplies to last at least a few days.

In honor of National Preparedness Month in September, we want to remind members of our community about the power of preparation. While you don't have to achieve a "doomsday prepper" level of preparedness, there are several practical steps you can take to keep you and your family safe.

Even at a modest level, preparation can help reduce stress, anxiety and lessen the impact of an emergency event. We recommend starting with the basics.



Here are general guidelines recommended by the Federal Emergency Management Agency:

- Assemble a grab-and-go disaster kit. Include items like nonperishable food, water (one gallon per person, per day), diapers, batteries, flashlights, prescription medications, first-aid kit, battery-powered radio and phone chargers.
- Develop a plan for communicating with family and friends (i.e., via text, social media, third party, etc.).
- Have some extra cash available; during a power outage, electronic card readers and cash machines may not work.
- Store important documents (birth certificates, property deed, etc.) in a safe place away from home (for example, a bank safe deposit box).
- Keep neighbors and coworkers apprised of your emergency plans.
- Fill your car with gas.
- Organize your supplies so they are together in an easily accessible location that family members know about.

Board of Directors Tour CIPCO Summit Lake Facility for August Board Meeting

The Board of Directors were invited to tour the Central Iowa Power Cooperative's (CIPCO) Summit Lake facility for their August 29 board meeting. The Board traveled to Creston, Iowa where the gas powered plant is operated.

In 2021, an expansion project was completed following the demolition of the 68-year-old steam plant. As part of the repowering project, three efficient natural gas-fired reciprocating engines were installed that produces 110 megawatts of power to assist during times of peak energy use. CIPCO and PCEA remain focused on a balanced and diverse generation portfolio. This expansion encompasses diversity in project geography and fuel sources.



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
